



# SLOVAKIA AND RES GOVERNANCE

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- Full respect of the European Council conclusions on 2030 climate and energy package
  - no compulsory national or regional targets
  - self-imposed national targets
  - voluntary cooperation
- RES governance part of national energy and climate plans
  - Council conclusions on Energy Union governance from 26 November 2015
  - Flexible governance: technological neutrality, synergies between respective goals

# ROLE OF THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION

- Motivation for the Member States: full ownership of goals stipulated by the 2030 climate and energy package
- Commission:
  - Sharing of best practice on RES deployment in a most cost-efficient way
  - Analytical support, guidance when developing national energy and climate plans

## BENCHMARKS

- Needed already at first consultations on national energy and climate plans
- Should not be based on one criterium
- Take into account economic situation in the country (GDP/capita)
- Potential for RES development, nature characteristics, historical structure of energy system and industry (energy intensity, potential of networks)
- Share of other low carbon sources in the energy mix
- Flat rate increase
  - Not to inadequately burden some Member States

## FILLING THE GAP

- Think positive – most of the EU Member States already now fulfilling their 2020 objectives
- First assessment in 2025
- First draft of measures to be used in case of not reaching EU targets to be presented after first consultations on national energy and climate plans
